The Davis County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on Monday, September 23, 2024 with Chairman David Henderson and Members Alan Yahnke and Ron Bride present.

Ron Bride made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve the agenda.

During public comments, Junior Reese and Sammy Ford questioned the Board about the changes being made to the offices in the 203 S. Madison building. No action was taken.

Dave Henderson made motion, seconded by Alan Yahnke and carried unanimously, to approve and sign the Minutes of Monday, September 16, 2024.

The Board met with John Schroeder, from Davis County Development Corporation, to discuss the office being modified for him to occupy, in the county-owned, 203 S. Madison building. Progress was discussed and no action was taken.

The Board met with Engineer Ryan Schock, who reported on County-crew projects being done around the County, including the Lilac Avenue seal-coat, the Ice Avenue and 180th St. repairs, the finishing work on the Dykes and Vetch bridges and the beginning of the Shale Avenue bridge this week.
